

America, we marched with pride. We gave our life, for you we died.


How well we knew the time might come; When life could sound that final drum.

The torch; be yours to hold it high.
If ye break faith with us who die
We shall not sleep, though poppies grow
In Flanders fields.

FLAG ETIQUETTE:

Here are some tips to make sure your tribute is a respectful one:

Display the flag only between sunrise and sunset on buildings and stationary flagstaffs. The flag may be displayed for twenty-four hours if illuminated in darkness.

Do not display the flag in inclement weather.

Whether displaying the flag vertically or horizontally, make sure the canton of stars is visible on the upper left-hand side. Do not let the flag touch the ground. An unusable flag that is damaged and worn and can no longer be displayed should be destroyed in a dignified way by burning. When not on display, the flag should be respectfully folded into a triangle, symbolizing the tricorn hats worn by colonial soldiers in the Revolutionary War.

The folded flag has 13 folds meaning:

- 1. Life
- 2. Eternal Life
- 3. Deceased Soldiers
- 4. In God We Trust for guidance
- 5. Our country, United States of America
- 6. Where our hearts lie-Pledge of Allegiance
- 7. Our Armed Forces-Protecting/Preserving
- Tribute to the one who entered into the valley of the shadow of death that we might see the light of day; Mother's Day
- Womanhood faith, love, loyalty and devotion who mold our men & women
- 10. Tribute to fathers who gave their sons and daughters for the country's defense
- 11. Jewish tribute to the Seal of David; God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob
- Christian tribute to God the Father, Son and Spirit
- 13. Thirteen original colonies

'In Flanders Fields' is also the name of an American War Cemetery in Belgium, where 368 Americans are buried. This cemetery is situated near the village of Waregem, quite a distance from the place where McCrae actually wrote his poem. The cemetery got its name from the poem though. The bronze foot of the flag-staff is decorated with daisies and poppies.

How many veterans are living in the USA today? 19 million

There are actually more than 19 million war veterans in the United States, according to the Department of Veterans Affairs. This includes veterans from World Wars I and II, as well as the Korean Conflict, the Vietnam War, and the Persian Gulf War.

Imagine 380 football stadiums full of people and you've got the picture. That's a lot of veterans!


How is the best way to honor the veterans? Fly the flag.

Why is Veterans Day on November 11? November 11 marks the end of World War I. To be more precise, fighting officially ended at 11 AM, November 11, 1918--the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month!

On November 11, 1921, an unknown World War I American soldier was buried in Arlington National Cemetery. This site, on a hillside overlooking the Potomac River and the city of Washington, became the focal point of reverence for America's veterans.



The Army is the branch of the Armed Forces whose troops are trained for fighting on land.






A submarine is a ship that can travel under the sea.

The Marine Corps is the branch of the Armed Forces whose troops




are trained for fighting on land and at sea.


Father, guard and guide the soldiers who fly
